

A Fresh Start

And in the blink of an eye 2018 is gone, and 2019 is upon us. I've heard that the older you get the more you feel time pass quickly by. This might be to do with having experienced so much already, but I'd also like to think that the God who put eternity into our hearts (cf Ecclesiastes 3:11) has also set a timer so that as we get older we feel it all the more. We were made for something more, and the older we get, the more time passes, the more we feel this.

Often in response we busy ourselves – we pack our schedules, we increase our workload, we put our heads down and hurry about our daily lives. But each and every one of us, in the quiet moments when there is nothing we can do (perhaps before we drift off to sleep), each ask the same question: 'Where has the time gone?'

And in that question is the ticking of the timer, reminding us that eternity is around the corner.

Francis Chan, pastor and speaker, uses an illustration that Ben and I have used before as well. He brings into his talk a long piece of rope – long enough to go around the stage, and around the hall/room he is speaking in. He asks us to picture this rope as a timeline – stretching infinitely off into eternity. He then holds one end up which has approximately 10cm covered in red tape. This 10cm of red tape represents our lives in contrast to eternity.

Here's the punch of this illustration: we spend about 2.5cm of the first part of that line being born and educated. The next 4cm of that rope we spend working, sometimes very hard, to enjoy the final 3cm or so. There is nothing inherently wrong with this – but how much of this precious small red tape of life is spent preparing and helping others prepare for the eternity to come?

2018 is gone. 2019 is upon us. Would that we use this coming year not just being busy with ourselves and our own preoccupations, but pray that we all might use this coming year well to prepare for the eternity that awaits us, and help others around us to do the same.
